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RE-UNIFICATION PROCEDURES

In the event of a major emergency where students will be need to be re-unified with their families, the following will take place:

At Gordon Head Middle School, we will set up the school grounds with the **Double-Gate System for Re-unification** to establish a safe area for staff to release students to parents/guardians and/or authorized emergency contacts/neighbours/friends.

The following steps will be followed:

- 1. **Staff Greeters** will be positioned around the school grounds to direct arriving parents and other authorized persons to the **Check-In Gate (1)**.
- 2. Arriving parents and other authorized persons will be divided in alphabetical lines corresponding to the first letter of the family name of the student(s) being picked up.
- 3. A staff member will ask for **government issued picture ID** (driver's license, passport, etc.) to confirm the parent/guardian is listed as authorized on the Student Information Verification (SIV) form to receive the student(s).
- 4. If parents consider having friends or neighbours, not listed on the SIV form, pick up their student, they would need to provide those individuals with an **authorization note along with a copy of a parent photo ID issued by the government**.
- 5. Upon verification of authorization, ID, etc., staff will take note of destination (where the student will be taken to) and pick-up time; then Staff Runners will connect parents/guardians with their student(s) at Release Gate (2).

DURING AN ACTUAL EMERGENCY:

 Please keep in mind that during an actual event, staff at the school will be very busy accounting for all the students and establishing a safe area for them to be reunited with their parents and/or guardians.



- Please DO NOT phone the school following a disaster. We must keep the lines open for outgoing emergency calls.
- Listen and watch for updates. Both the school and the District will use a variety of communication tools, including phone trees, email, traditional and social media to alert parents of the current situation and next steps.
- If possible, DO NOT drive up to the school. Streets may be damaged and access to the school must remain clear for emergency vehicles.
- This can be an incredibly stressful time for everyone and having a pre-determined and practiced plan will provide physical and psychological safety for all students in the aftermaths of a disaster.
- Re-unification can be a slow process. Please do not expect to arrive at the school and be able to pick up your child(ren) immediately. In these situations, there are typically line-ups of parents/guardians waiting to sign out their students.
- While you and your child(ren) will be anxious to be reunited, PLEASE be patient we must follow our protocols to ensure staff and student safety.

Parents/Guardians are responsible to provide the school with accurate and updated information about a child's emergency contacts, family phone numbers, etc.
