Electric kick scooter pilot project extended

Saanich is one of many communities in BC that is participating in B.C.'s <u>Electric Kick Scooter Pilot Project</u> that will run from April 5, 2024 to April 5, 2028. Of particular interest is the following safety rules you may not have been aware of:



Safety rules you must follow:

- You must obey provincial rules when operating an electric kick scooter. Participating communities may also set rules where you can ride an electric kick scooter. Check with your municipality to understand what rules apply to you.
- Must be 16 or older: a person under 16 cannot ride an electric kick scooter, nor can their parent or guardian knowingly permit it.

Student Learning Survey 2024/2025

Greetings Families. It is time again to conduct the Ministry Student Learning Survey. The Provincial Student Learning Survey is unique in its scope, size and usefulness to schools. It gathers information from parents/guardians/caregivers, teachers, and students on topics related to school environment, safety, and achievement. The information is used for planning in individual schools and provides a district and provincial perspective.


Early in 2025, the Student Learning Survey will be administered to students in grades 7, their parents/guardians/caregivers, and all school staff. We encourage parents/guardians/caregivers to participate in this survey, as the results are important in identifying and celebrating current strengths, as well as determining where the school needs to focus improvement.

The surveys contain standard questions for the Province – in addition, questions from the school and/or district that focus on local conditions or issues may be included. The survey can be completed electronically and can be accessed on the Internet at https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/education-training/k-12/support/student-learning-survey. Any computer or mobile device with an Internet connection can be used, and access to the e-survey is simple and secure. The survey can be accessed through the link and by clicking on Take the Survey. On the login page, click on the Parents icon, and then select the school district and school name where your child attends school. Provincial, District and School Reports for previous years can be viewed at the same site under the Results section.

The e-survey site will be open until May 2, 2025.
