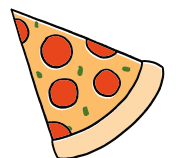
Thursday Fun Lunches

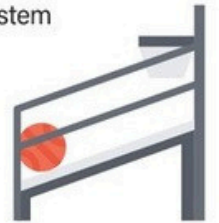
